Physician Assistance, Information, and Needs for the Diagnosis and Treatment of Fibromyalgia

Target audience

Physicians, physician assistants, nursing professionals, and pharmacists.

Statement of need/program overview

The creation of the National Fibromyalgia Association (NFA) Pain Kit is partially the result of information captured from a 2007 NFA healthcare provider (HCP) survey that demonstrated the lack of confidence most HCPs reflect concerning making a fibromyalgia (FM) diagnosis and prescribing appropriate FM treatment regimens. While the survey of 552 HCPs showed that 87% of 100 rheumatologists are very confident in making a fibromyalgia diagnosis, only 6% of 103 OB/GYNs are very confident, with only 28% of 101 primary care physicians, 23% of 100 psychiatrists, and 34% of 51 anesthesiologists very confident in diagnosing fibromyalgia. The majority of the HCPs in this survey cited a lack of education about fibromyalgia in general: the American College of Rheumatology (ACR) fibromyalgia diagnostic criteria including how to execute the physical examination; and a lack of knowledge about treatment options including tools to better understand the science of fibromyalgia and resources to help their patients, as major issues in their medical handling of this disorder.
